

Spin Art T-Shirts

Ages 5 and Up

You can imagine my excitement when I discovered that you can use fabric paint in a spin art machine then print your design on a t-shirt. The spin art design transfers perfectly, every time! As if spin art wasn't cool enough already! 😊



Materials:

White Pre-Washed Cotton T-Shirts
Fabric Paints – look for paints in squeeze bottles
Spin Art Machine – look in larger craft stores or online
Poster Board Pieces – cut to fit in your machine.

Directions:

1. Insert some paper inside the shirt to keep the paints from soaking through.
2. Lay out the shirt on a flat surface next to your spin art machine.
3. Select 3 or 4 paint colors.
4. Turn on the machine. When the spinning has reached full-speed then your child can begin squeezing smallish amounts of paint onto the spinning card stock. You'll soon figure out the right amount of paint to use. Don't take **too** long on your picture because the paint might dry before you can get it on your shirt.
5. Once the spinning has stopped and she's satisfied with her picture, remove the card from the machine and press it paint-side-down on the t-shirt. Rub all over the back of the card to ensure the whole design gets transferred to the shirt. Remove the card and throw away.
6. Repeat if desired. Clean your spin art machine as soon as you're finished.
7. Allow to dry overnight before wearing. Wait another day before washing.
